# What you need to know

- About 14% of US households with school aged children do not have an internet connection at home, according to US data.
- Adults are dependent on the internet more than ever. In a Gallup survey, 33% of Americans said they now "always" work remotely.
- Providing broadband (high-speed internet) throughout the US would require action from Congress and cost between \$6 billion and \$11 billion in the first year.
